- CLASS 15 An autumn arrangement, may include fruit and vegetables
- CLASS 16 A table arrangement for a country wedding
- CLASS 17 A vase of garden flowers & foliage
- CLASS 18 3 specimen blooms
- CLASS 19 An item of craft. i.e. Pottery, Jewellery, Metalwork, Woodwork
- CLASS 20 Homemade bunting (max 2m)
- CLASS 21 An item of textile craft i.e. Cross stitch, Tapestry, Embroidery etc
- CLASS 22 An item of lacework
- CLASS 23 An item of crochet or knitting
- CLASS 24 A painting or drawing
- CLASS 25 A photograph – ‘Sky’s the limit’ to be mounted on A4 paper for display purposes
